Bart Cochrane, CEO of LEAP Housing was present to address the Council. He said because this is a federally funded work force housing project, there is limitation on the amount of rent that can be charged.

Councilman Stokes said he is against impact fees at this time, because of where the economy is.

Councilwoman Garvey said she felt it was important to remind the Council that any impact fees waived is money the city has to come up with. So the City will need to come up with a \$175,000.00 difference out of the budget somewhere.

Paula Szafranski, City Treasurer said in the past they have waived impact fees on projects, but they did have to transfer money out of the street budget into the street impact budget to adjust for that waiver.

Bart said without the fees being waived it does put the project in jeopardy.

Councilman McCain said because the City's budget would have to make up the difference for any waived impact fees he would make a motion to deny entering into a development agreement with Leap Housing to pay the prior impact fee of \$1,050.18 per dwelling unit rather than the existing impact fee of \$3,977.00 per dwelling unit. Councilwoman Garvey seconded the motion.

Councilman Stokes said he hopes, regardless of the outcome tonight, Leap is able to bring a housing development to Mountain Home.
