The Council discussed they would like to look into expanding the community center for that area above 3,000 sq ft, but they were happy with it being set to a 3,000 sq ft minimum and the benefits of the City being given the green space once the work has been done to develop it into a park space.

FINAL COMMENTS

- Jake Olsen, Golf Course Superintendent said they had a youth tournament and had 140 kids participating.
- Brock Cherry, Community Development Director thanked the Council for approving the plats tonight. He said he is excited to bring something new to the market in Mountain Home. The Dutch Bros Grand Opening will be next week and Grocery Outlet is moving along as well.
- Shirley Batchelor, Wastewater Superintendent said the second alfalfa harvest was last week and they are concentrating on monitoring wells now because of DEQ testing.
- Darcy Braithwaite said they are in the sixth week of summer programming and are planning fall programming. Last week they had the Sundae Splash and Dash with ninety participants.
- Miguel Pedroza, Parks Superintendent said they are focusing on irrigation and maintaining the parks. He said the URA has agreed to help pay for finishing the walking path in railroad park.
- Police Chief, Scott Conner said they have a new police lieutenant starting and they have three conditional employment offers out. He said they are hoping to be fully staffed by December.

Mayor Sykes told Chief Conner to pass on his thanks to the PD officers for all the hard work they have done with the calls being up over 600 year to date so far. He said all the hard work doesn't go unnoticed.

- \bullet Dave Sonnentag, Water Superintendent said they are finishing up a couple of downtown projects. They are replacing hydrants on North $3^{\rm rd}$ Street.
- Shasta Hochstrasser, Library Director said the summer reading program was a success and she was informed today she was awarded a grant for the library to help with laptops.
- Fire Chief, Mark Moore said the fourth of July fireworks were great and thanked all the other City Departments for their help with that. So far they have been fortunate not to have a lot of fire calls this summer. He said the URA contributed \$50,000.00 toward the restoration of the fire truck that sits downtown.
- Hank Patrick, Building Official said the Code Enforcer is back so that should help with code issues in town and there are a lot of new homes being built right now and that is keeping the department busy.
- Rich Urquidi, Public Works Director said the crews have been busy working on the streets. He said ITD will rip out the last piece of the bike path and straighten it out to go under the underpass. He said Guho is on schedule right now with the Downtown Project.
- Paula Szafranski, City Treasurer said they are finalizing the budget. She said the Festival of Beer is coming up and they are looking for volunteers. Paula said it is a great event and from it they are able to give back to Light the Forest.
- Tiffany Belt, City Clerk said she is working with ICRMP to do Supervisor Training in the near future.
- Councilman Bundy said he has seen the City crews working hard around town. He said the downtown businesses are pleased the project is on schedule but he said he had agreed to talk to Economic Development about putting more out there to the citizens about the downtown businesses being open during construction.
- Councilman Brennan asked Hank if he would be filling the part time position for Code Enforcement soon.

Mayor Sykes said currently the executive leadership team decided while the PD is patrolling, they will take timestamped photos and send them to the Code Enforcer, and he will send a letter out to the residence in question. He said for now it should help Code Enforcement catch up on things.

- Councilman Brennan said Adventure Camp has been a great program this year.
- Councilman Stokes said he thinks the growth in Mountain Home is great. He said he has been working with a Councilman in Boise to revamp the Animal Ordinance, he said he should have a rough draft ready for everyone soon.
- Councilman McCain said the Splash and Dash was a great event and thanked Darcy Braithwaite, Recreation Superintendent and Mark Moore, Fire Chief for putting it on.
- Mayor Sykes said growth needs to pay for itself and the Council will start to see money from the fees the City charges coming into the City as these developments are built. He said the crew from Prineville will be coming here to Mountain Home to give advice on the Industrial Park and getting the rail line up and running. Director of Commerce Keely will be

here Wednesday to check out the City's Broadband Program. The City will be going out for another CARES Act grant and he said he appreciates the Council for allowing the City to pursue grants, it has been through grants the City has been able to accomplish so much in the last few years.
