Update HUB ERN/Confirm approval of the ERN. ACTION ITEM: Seems like not much is happening, but Mr. Weitz assures a lot is going on behind the scenes. Goal is to have building down by end of this year, hoping by November. There is still no contract in place and the URA has not received the ERN. Mr. Weitz advised changes will be made and ERN will be given to URA as soon as tomorrow. Need contract as it protects both parties. Discussion is good, but need a signed document to proceed. There will need to be a Fair Use Appraisal, as this cannot be bypassed.

Idaho Power's preliminary cost estimate to bury the power lines: Waiting for estimate and contract with Idaho Power. Moving power poles is not an option because of buildings on the other side of the alley. Burying lines is possible.

Adult Academy Update: Permits for construction have been applied for. The URA's architect, Rudeen Architects, has the plans and will their opinion soon. The URA has a contract with a Fair Use appraiser. He has started work on it but we don't have a completion date.

Update on Railroad Park Pavilion and Sidewalk: Pavilion will be complete this week. The walkways are in. Ready to plant sod. Work on erecting the pavilion has been done by volunteers.

Update on Antique Firetruck Project: Firetruck is beautiful. Great detail with history boards. Great addition to downtown.

Business from floor: Commissioner Bermensolo wanted to remind that the URA commissioners are custodians of tax dollars and they can only be spent in one area. \$6.7 million has been reinvested to date. Mayor Sykes wanted to share sincere thanks to the URA for continuing history, improving infrastructures, and helping with Railroad Park which is the cherry on top of downtown.
