The Council of the City of Mountain Home, Elmore County, Idaho, met at the Mountain Home City Hall Chambers, 160 South $3^{\rm rd}$ East, Mountain Home, Idaho on June $26^{\rm th}$, 2017. A quorum was established with, Councilman Bundy, Councilman Schroeder, Councilman Schipani, Councilman Bryant and Mayor Sykes being present.

PRESENTATION - Government Purchasing/Danny Downen with State of Idaho Division of Purchasing

• Daniel Downen gave a presentation on state purchasing and how it could be a benefit to political subdivisions such as towns, counties and police departments.

RECOGNIZING PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE

ullet Tim Eckberg was present and asked how the new City web site was coming along.

Paula Riggs, Economic Development Director said they are in phase two of developing it right now and it will be ready in August or September.

Tim asked what the City had planned for public safety during the eclipse in August.

Police Chief, Nick Schilz said they will be meeting with the County Emergency Manager who has already been working with the state to prepare and the Police Department will be running exercises with her before the eclipse.

Tim asked how the WECRD and the City work together, specifically about the City pool.

Mayor Sykes said the City had the funds this year to fix the filtration and chlorination systems for the City pool without asking for any help but it really did need to be fixed as there were safety hazards and he would be getting with the WECRD in the future if they are interested in helping fix the actual pool itself.

• Lindsey Dorsey was present and asked about the decision to change the advisory boards to advisory committees and what was the difference between boards and committees.

Nina Patterson, City Clerk answered advisory boards have the power to make decisions and the Council is the only body with the authority to make decisions for the City. A committee makes recommendations, more than decisions.

Lindsey asked if there was a reason to have the change put in that a committee could be suspended.

Councilman Schipani said that is in the ordinance already right now and a board has only been suspended once and that was the Golf Advisory Board.

• Jasmine Gartin was present to discuss residents keeping bee hives in residential areas.

Mayor Sykes said they are working to make it so bees are only allowed in areas with a square footage minimum which would eliminate residential areas.

• Derek Forg with Idaho Fish and Game was present with Willie Heackathorn, Carl Claycomb, Dean Shultz, Amanda Dickensen, Brendan Wilson, Jay Barnett, Zachary Schultz and several other people to discuss taking the old Animal Shelter building and turning it into an indoor/outdoor archery range with three classrooms to teach various classes.
