Items Removed from Consent Agenda Section

There were no items removed from the Consent Agenda to be discussed at this meeting.

Discussion on increase to Cemetery Fees

Mayor Sykes said the reason he had this added to the agenda is to see if this is something the Council would like to look into further. He said they will need to open up a new section of cemetery behind Rost Funeral Home, within a few years. The current rates have not been increased since 2015.

Larry Cronin, Cemetery Sexton said it would be ten to fifteen years before it would be necessary, but at current prices it would cost about \$80,000.00 for the irrigation system, piping and roads. Currently there are 1100 spaces still available in the current cemetery.

Councilman Schipani asked if the available plots could still be purchased or are some of them already owned by residents.

Larry answered those are the plots still available for purchase.

Councilman Perez asked if the City was lacking in maintenance cost for taking care of the cemetery last year.

Paula Szafranski, City Treasurer said nothing was lacking there was a cash carryover of \$31,000.00.

Councilman Perez said without the \$31,000.00 carryover we would be trying to make that up in the budget somewhere.

Paula said that was correct.

Councilman Perez said he thought this was something they needed more information on before they could make a decision.

Mayor Sykes asked if there was any planning for inflation.

Nina Patterson, City Clerk said they have to pay the opening and closing fees at the current rate when someone is buried in the plot but the plot is paid for at the price it was when they buy the plot and no inflation is figured in.

Councilman Bundy said he didn't think it was possible to raise the prices of plots enough to cover all of the operating funds. He said it is a service provided to the City and he thought maybe more should be allocated to the cemetery from the budget.

Councilman Bryant asked should the cemetery budget match what the operating costs are.

Councilman Schipani said he would entertain a three or four percent increase. He said he would like to see the costs from other area cemeteries before deciding on this matter, if possible.

It was decided City Clerk, Nina Patterson would bring back more information to the Council on what other area cemeteries are charging.

• Mayor Sykes said last week he went to the City of Ammon's Fiber Conference and all of the surrounding cities were there. He said without fiber in your town, your town is a dying town. Everyone wants internet all the time at a fair price. It is considered to be a utility now.

Councilman Bryant said he likes the idea of looking further into fiber.

• Councilman Perez said he would like to put a working group together so that all the council members can have a better knowledge of what is going on with projects within the City.
