The Council of the City of Mountain Home, Elmore County, Idaho, met at Mountain Home City Hall, 160 South 3rd East, Mountain Home, Idaho on April 19th, 2018. A quorum was established with, Councilman Bryant, Councilman Brennan, Councilman Bundy, and Mayor Sykes being present at 5:00 P.M. Councilman Schipani appeared by telephone.

There was a discussion on the requested amendments to the contract with the WECRD for the Baseball Fields or the City paying C-2 Construction for the dug-outs.

Councilman Schipani said he felt all of this had gone on long enough and C-2 Construction needs to be paid.

Councilman Bundy agreed.

Mayor Sykes said he agreed also and felt if the City were to pay the \$22,807.00 owed to C-2 Construction at least the City would remain in control of what happens with the ball fields. He said he felt the money to pay for this should come out of the contingency fund since there is pending litigation over the matter.

Councilman Brennan said he was disappointed in the actions of the WECRD over this matter.

Councilman Schipani made a motion to void the proposed contract with the WECRD and pay the amount of \$22,807.00 to C-2 Construction out of the City's Contingency Fund. Councilman Bryant seconded the motion.
