- Tiffany Belt, Recreation Superintendent said the Spooktacular at the park will be held this Friday.
- Keith Forsyth, Fiber Optics Manager said they are just south of American Legion and anticipate crossing later this week or early next.
- Mayor Sykes said they had a fiber meeting with Jeff Christiansen and Robert Peterson from Entry Point. He said hopefully soon they will be back with a building proposal. He said Derek Wheeler, IT Manager has a bunch of things back ordered but is working on the internet connection issues as those orders come in.
- Councilman Bundy welcomed the members of the Library Board that attended the City Council meeting. He said they have a great idea to get the City Council and the Library Board together so everyone can better understand the relationship between the City and the Library.
- Councilman Brennan said he has been participating in the Elmore County Health Coalition and wanted to point out there are crisis hot lines people can call if they are having a mental health crisis. He said in Boise there are options where you can stay for twenty-four hours if needed and it is free. On November 15th there will be a behavioral health summit at the American Legion Post #26.
