Sidewalks

The sidewalks along Main Street on block 1, between East Jackson and East 2nd North Street, have been completely demo'd and prepped for curb and gutter to be poured beginning Monday, October 14th. Sidewalk placement is scheduled for the week of October 21st. Prior to, Guho will be checking in with businesses to coordinate. If weather cooperates, sidewalk placement is scheduled to be complete by the end of October.

Block 2, between East 2nd North Street and American Legion, has also been demo'd and prepped ahead of schedule. Concrete placing will begin late next week (October 14-18) starting with curb and gutter and followed by light pole bases and electrical and irrigation trenching. Sidewalk work will begin the week of October 28th and expected to be completed the first week of November.

Major sidewalk demo is tentatively scheduled to begin the week of October 28th for block 3, between American Legion and East 4th North Street.

Utilities

East Jackson and East 2nd North Street have been opened for through access and American Legion, as of Friday, October 11th, has also been reopened. Main lines in these intersections have been relocated and storm drains installed.

Pedestrian Walkways & Access

Crews will be working to fill in a vault located in front of Frankie's Burgers this week and coordinating closely with affected businesses along Main. Access along the second block will be maintained for pedestrians and customers.

Traffic Control Patterns

- Although the intersection of Main Street and East 2nd North Street is open for through traffic, crews may need to close the intersection periodically but will try to keep it open as much as possible.
- The intersection of Main Street and East 4th North Street is closed and will remain closed for at least one more week.
- The intersection of Main Street and East 5th North Street will be closed the week of October 21st.
