The Council of the City of Mountain Home, Elmore County, Idaho, met at the Mountain Home City Hall Chambers, 160 South 3rd East, Mountain Home, Idaho on December 13th, 2021. A quorum was established with, Councilman McCain, Councilman Brennan, Councilman Stokes, Councilman Bundy, and Mayor Sykes being present.

PRESENTATION

1) Recognition of Planning and Zoning Commissioner James Eskridge for his service on the Planning and Zoning Commission.

James Eskridge was unable to be present tonight, so this item was moved to the next meeting.

2) Alexis Pickering on the Get Healthy Idaho Grant.

Alexis Pickering was present and gave a presentation on the Get Healthy Idaho Grant. It is collaborative grant between the Elmore County Health Coalition and the Central District Health.

RECOGNIZING PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE

- Misty Pierce came forward and spoke about the salary of Mountain Home Department Heads and what she feels is a waste of taxpayer money on some of the Department Heads, particularly the Public Works Director because he does not have an engineering degree.
- Brock Cherry spoke as a citizen of Mountain Home. He said he appreciates the work of the Department Heads, particularly Rich Urquidi, Director of Public Works. He said he does not believe Rich makes what a Public Works Director would make if he had an engineering degree. The amount of work Rich does is exponential in value to the City.
- Megan Young asked in the future if there is a way to communicate concerns with the council or it could be read aloud in public hearing that would be helpful.

Paul Fitzer, City Attorney explained the process by which public comment could be received for Public Hearings.

• Traci Lefever asked Paul Fitzer if she had already testified in Public Hearing and there was a blatant lie told how that is addressed.

Paul said there is always an appeal process and explained how that would work.

citizen does make a solid point that does change his mind what he should do.

Paul Fitzer, City Attorney said at that point you raise your concerns at the City Council meeting with the other Council members.

- Councilman Brennan said he received emails from Laura McManus, Tyler Parish, Michael Lewis and Molly Carothers. He said he read the emails but did not respond and he can remain unbiased. He said the emails were regarding access to the property owners on Airbase Rd and wanting to know why we are proceeding without the Airport Overlay. He said another concern was that the units were not affordable.

Rachelle Klein from Republic Services explained the process of how they use the Consumer Price Index to come up with a price change that is fair to the customer as well as Republic Services.

Councilman Brennan wanted to clarify that the citizens are paying for the trash to be taken to the landfill not for the landfill to take in the trash.

Rachelle said that was correct.

Councilman Brennan wanted to point out the rates for commercial trash would be brought back to the Council separately.

Councilman Brennan said he felt this was rushed and in clarity he wanted to say the Council has not seen the rough draft of the Airport Overlay and he feels it is being hidden from the Council for a specific reason. He said the mayor has information the Council does not.

Councilman Stokes said first and foremost as a Councilman he feels it is important to protect the City's assets, like the Airport and that is why he feels it would be important to see the Airport Overlay.

Councilman Bundy said he likes to see the community active in the planning process. He said along the way in the process the City has been sure to follow the rules. He said he has not seen the Airport Overlay, but he doesn't believe there has been any deceitfulness in not seeing the overlay. Councilman Bundy said one thing the Council cannot do is change the rules midgame and the developer has met all the requirements that have been given to him.

Councilman Brennan said legal counsel said the City Council needed to answer to the Mountain Home City Code 9-6-4 subsection C2 A-E. E says to promote to keep City limit boundaries that are squared off and are not irregular in shape and he would argue the irregularity of the shape if it is passed. He asked if the developer had agreed to additional sound barrier requirements.

Brock Cherry, Community Development Director said the developer had agreed to that.

Councilman Brennan asked Mayor Sykes why he would not agree to show the rough draft of the Airport Overlay to the Council.

Mayor Sykes said because he does not have it. He said he gave the rough draft to the City Attorney, and he is going through the legal process of it.

Councilman Brennan said he does not believe that. He asked if there was an email chain of this process.

Brock said he had emailed it.

Paul Fitzer, City Attorney said if an Airport Overlay were passed tomorrow, it would not apply to this subdivision. This application was put in before there was an Airport Overlay.

Councilman Brennan asked if he would argue this was not information the Council could use to educate themselves with.

Paul said he was not going to get into that.

Tiffany Belt, City Clerk said the Mellen Water District has been using City Services since September as there well has been down. She said they have been billed but the agreement states they will only be on City Services for thirty days at a time. She said she just wanted the Council to be aware of the situation.

Rich Urquidi, Public Works Director said the issue is an electrical part they are having a hard time getting.

Councilman Bundy said so it isn't an issue of them being negligent they are just having issue getting the part.

Rich said that was correct and he felt Mellen has been in open communication with the City.

Councilman Stokes asked if there was just one user or if there were many.

Mayor Sykes said there are at least 114 users. He asked if the Council would like to recount the users there. He said the City is trying to help the County residents in that area as they are not City residents.

It was decided to give the Mellen Subdivision until January 28, 2022 to get their well up and running again as long as they kept in regular contact with the City.

Action Item: Cancel the December 27, 2021 City Council meeting and authorize the monthly expenditures.

Councilman Brennan said they wouldn't be blanket passing bills they would get approved at the next Council meeting.

Paula Szafranski, City Treasurer said the utilities and vendors would be paid but approval for purchase of equipment would be pushed to the first Council meeting in January. She said we don't want the vendors to not be paid.

Tiffany Belt, City Clerk said if an employee has already left the store with a product it has to be paid for.

Paula said if it is the purchase of something like a truck that would wait for approval. She said if it is for instance Idaho Power, they will pay them.

Tiffany said routine business and day to day operations will be paid.

Councilman Bundy said if it was a prebudgeted item it would be paid for but if it was outside of that it would have to come back to the Council.

Tiffany said that was correct.

Councilman Brennan said he felt like the expenditures didn't need to be reviewed if the City was going to pay them regardless.

Councilman McCain said if someone spent three hundred dollars on a hammer and he sees it in the expenditures it still has to be paid but the Council can question it and let them know not to do something like that again.

Tiffany said it is the Council's job to hold the City employees accountable for their spending.

Action Item: Deliberation/Decision on Planning and Zoning recommendation for zone R4 with PUD entitled "Paiute Place" PUD.

Terran Mitchell was present and expressed his deepest regards to the City employees he works with and all the help they give him. He gave a presentation to the Council about the Paiute Place PUD.

Arthur Young was present, he is working with the developer on this project.

Terran said this is a medium density subdivision proposing 64 units. He said they are proponents of water conservation and will be cognizant of that with landscaping. He said they have more parking planned than what is required. The greenspace will be left in control of the HOA and will have areas for children to play.

Councilman Stokes said he feels like there has been a lot of thought put into this project and because it is a infill project there is already water and sewer nearby.

Councilman McCain asked since this is a private drive is the City still in the practice of not maintaining sewer and water lines on a private road.

Director of Public Works, Rich Urquidi said there would be an easement. And they would contract any work that needed to be done to the roads.

Brock Cherry, Community Development Director said in projections there could be three thousand new homes eventually on the south part of town and that would make South $5^{\rm th}$ West a main arterial road. In preparation of that they wanted to limit exiting onto that road as much as possible.

Councilman Brennan asked how the fire truck only access would work and how it would be ensured no one would leave through there.

Terran said there are many ways to from gates to chains to keep people from exiting through there and they would take input from the city on how to best go about it.

Councilman Brennan said he also felt having no access from South 5th West might be a mistake. He wondered if there could be a right turn only exit from onto the road. Councilman Brennan also suggested there could be a lefthand turn lane put in leading to the new subdivision.

Councilman McCain asked if there was enough room on South $5^{\rm th}$ West to accommodate a turn lane.

Rich said he thought it might be wide enough and they would look into it.

Action Item: Deliberation/Decision on Mr. Freer request appealing the City Zoning Administrator and Building Official decision.

Brock Cherry, Community Development Director said they had advised Mr. Freer that according to City Code a duplex on a corner in this zoning location would need an entrance facing each street and this one has been built so both front doors are on one street. After speaking with Councilman McCain he felt entrance could also mean driveway as it is not clearly defined in the code book. Brock said with a strict interpretation of the code he feels there should be a door on both streets and Mr. Freer was made aware of the Building Department's specifications.

Mike Freer addressed the Council and said were he to put in a door entrance to accommodate the Development Department's request he would have an awkward door in a garage that doesn't serve a purpose.

Councilman Brennan said he pulled the building permit, and it is addressed in the comments there should be a door on each street, so he wondered why this was done in violation of building code.

Mr. Freer said he is not in violation of the building permit because the construction isn't complete yet.

Councilman McCain said he wished Mr. Freer had come to the Council before moving forward with his project.

Councilman Stokes said he liked that the driveway was on the less busy street.
