**Discussion/Decision-Disposing of surplus personal property in the Hub building.** Commissioner Jett read the following resolution and made a motion to approve the resolution. Commissioner Yagues seconded. All vote AYE. Motion passes.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE MOUNTAIN HOME URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN HOME, IDAHO, ("AGENCY") RELATING TO SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE AGENCY, DECLARING SUCH PERSONAL PEOPERTY TO BE SURPLUS AND OF NO FURTHER USE TO THE AGENCY, AUTHORINZING AND DELEGATING TO THE CHAIRMAN, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION TO DISPOSE OF THE SURPLUS PROPERTY, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF APRIL 18<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

**Discussion-Disposition options related to HUB Building.** Mayor Sykes spoke to the Commissioners about Idaho Power and relocating powerlines due to Idaho Power not being obligated to pay for underground powerlines. Future ideas for the building continue to be discussed. No decisions were made.

**Discussion/Decision-Railroad Park project.** New concepts were presented by the Mayor and Tiffany Belt for the Railroad Park project. Discussion was directed at building a 1<sup>st</sup> class splash pad that could be a destination hot spot for the community and visitors with a skating rink in the winter. All agreed that the next step in this project will be to have architecture/engineering firm develop a design proposal. Commissioner Jett made a motion that we have Rudeen and Associates provide a proposal for said project. Commissioner Yagues seconded the motion. All vote AYE. Motion passes.

**Update-Sidewalks.** Sidewalks have not been completed but are moving along.

**Update-Website.** Website should be up by Thursday.

**Business from floor:** Mountain Home Adult Training Academy is intending to acquire a certificate of occupancy this Friday. It was discussed that they will have to install ADA compliant ramps before this happens. The clock in Railroad Park was also discussed as it no longer keeps time. After it is repaired, the city is looking to relocate it to a better place where it won't be destroyed by the weather.
