Councilman Brennan asked what is stated in the annexation agreement as far as bringing things up to code with curb, gutter, sidewalk and annexation fees as well as water rights.

Rich Urquidi, Director of Public Works said when development gets to that portion of land then they will have the burden of putting in the curb, gutter, and sidewalk.

Paul Fitzer, City Attorney said the annexation agreement is a binding agreement, so they will be required to put that in when development gets to that point.

Councilman Brennan said at that point the only recourse the city has is to withhold water or sewer from the property.

 $\,$ Paul said that was correct and that is the downside of doing things that way.

Councilman Green asked if the city could put a lien on someone's property if the city would be putting it in.

Paul said he would prefer to put that in the annexation agreement if that was an option the city might pursue.

Councilwoman Garvey was concerned if the city passed this annexation, it would in a way be opening the door to these requests.

Mayor Sykes said he felt if a property is annexed it needs to be on city services.

Councilman Brennan made a motion to approve annexation contingent upon the annexation agreement giving the property owner six months to complete any deferred item when the city asks for it to be done. If it isn't done within the time frame the city asks, the City will complete it and place a lien on the property. Or as directed by the City during the expected time period. Councilman Green seconded the motion.
